

## The International Affairs Budget Working for Hawaii

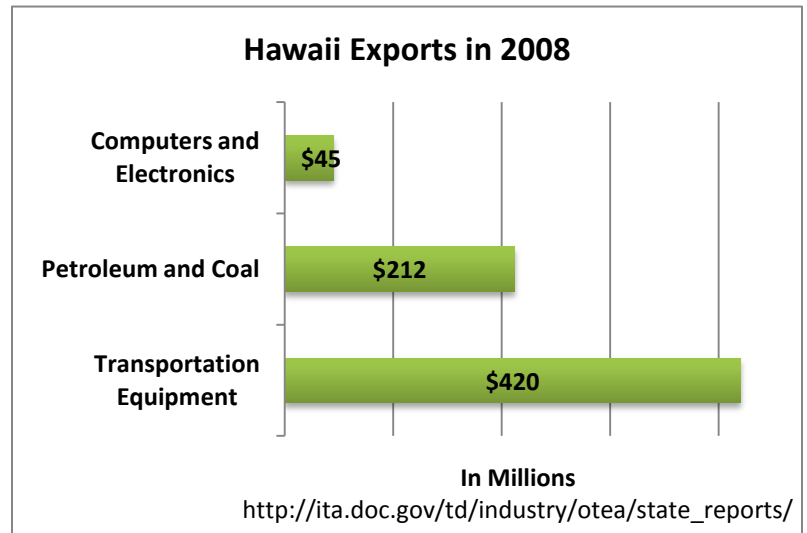
### Employment

- Trade supported 165,704 jobs in Hawaii in 2006, or 20.5% of total jobs, up from 11.4% in 1992.<sup>1</sup> More than 1.4% of all manufacturing workers in Hawaii depended on exports for their jobs.<sup>2</sup>
- In 2007, 30,800 people in Hawaii were employed by U.S. affiliates of companies that are at least 50% foreign-owned.<sup>3</sup>



### Trade

- Hawaii exported \$960 million in merchandise to 96 foreign markets in 2008 (133% increase over 2004). Hawaii's largest market in 2008 was Australia (\$375 million), followed by South Korea (\$110 million), Japan (\$94 million), China (\$75 million) and Singapore (\$75 million).<sup>4</sup>
- In 2007, 666 companies exported goods from Hawaii. Of these, 87% were small- and medium-sized enterprises with fewer than 500 employees.<sup>5</sup>
- Agricultural exports are important to Hawaii's economy, totaling \$100 million and supporting about 1,150 in 2008.<sup>6</sup>
- Since 2005, the U.S. Export-Import Bank has financed \$760,000 in exports from 4 companies in 2 categories in Hawaii.<sup>7</sup>



### Education

- In 2007-2008, 757 Hawaiian students studied abroad, a 15.6% increase over the previous academic year.<sup>8</sup>
- During 2008-2009, 5,275 international students were enrolled in Hawaiian colleges and universities and contributed \$111.3 million to the Hawaiian economy.<sup>9</sup>

### International Assistance Programs



- Since 1961, 1,294 Peace Corps volunteers from Hawaii have served in dozens of countries overseas.<sup>10</sup>
