

## The International Affairs Budget Working for Minnesota

### Employment

- Trade supported 626,025 jobs in Minnesota in 2006, or 18.3% of total jobs, up from 10.8% in 1992.<sup>1</sup> Over one-sixth (18.1%) of all manufacturing workers in Minnesota depended on exports for their jobs.<sup>2</sup>
- In 2007, 94,300 people in Minnesota were employed by U.S. affiliates of companies that are at least 50% foreign-owned.<sup>3</sup>



### Trade

- Minnesota exported \$19.2 billion in merchandise to 204 foreign markets in 2008. Minnesota's largest market in 2008 was Canada (\$5.7 billion) followed by China (\$1.0 billion), Japan (\$936 million), Ireland (\$885 million), and Mexico (\$863 million).<sup>4</sup>
- In 2007, 6,368 companies exported goods from Minnesota. Of these, 88% were small- and medium-sized enterprises with fewer than 500 employees.<sup>5</sup>
- Agricultural exports are important to Minnesota's economy, totaling \$5.4 billion and supporting about 62,548 jobs in 2008.<sup>6</sup>
- Since 2005, the U.S. Export-Import Bank has financed over \$705 million in exports from 124 companies in 52 communities in Minnesota.<sup>7</sup>



### Education

- In 2007-2008, 9,579 Minnesota students studied abroad, a 12.9% increase over the previous academic year.<sup>8</sup>
- During 2008-2009, 10,848 international students were enrolled in Minnesota colleges and universities and contributed \$232.8 million to the Minnesota economy.<sup>9</sup>

### International Assistance Programs



- Since 1961, 5,847 Peace Corps volunteers from Minnesota have served in dozens of countries overseas.<sup>10</sup>
- Support from U.S. government grants and contracts to private voluntary organizations engaged in foreign assistance and development in Minnesota totaled over \$25 million in 2007.<sup>11</sup>
