 points and other communications materials, including e-communications and regular blog postings.
- Media Outreach and Coordination—Develop media outreach plans for states where USGLC is expanding and growing, build relationships with reporters and bloggers in those states, create and identify media opportunities for state network leaders.
- Electronic Communications Strategy Assist in developing effective e-communications strategy that builds list, customizes writing for targeted audiences and monitors results. Writing and developing effective ecommunications with USGLC constituencies on consistent basis.
- Assist Communications Director Provide support to the Communications Director in media outreach, news monitoring, press events and other assignments as necessary.

Position Requirements:

The position requires at least 3-5 years of media and communications experience in a non-profit, campaign, trade association, Congressional office or similar environment. Excellent writing and organization skills and strong understanding of media and on-line technologies for advocacy communications required.
