## **CALIFORNIA**

## **BENEFITS OF THE INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS BUDGET**




California is one of the world's largest economies, fueled by trade and exports that support nearly 5.1 million jobs in the state. Last year, California exported \$175.1 billion worth of goods, led by the state's thriving computer and technology manufacturing industry. But it isn't just big business that benefits - 95% of all California exporters are small- and medium-sized businesses.

5.1M % JOBS

In California, **5,082,600 jobs** were supported by trade in 2019, representing **20.7%** of all jobs in the state.

In 2020, **63,416 companies** exported goods from California of which **95%** were **small- and medium-sized enterprises.** In 2019, **843,900 people** were employed by affiliates of companies at least 50% foreign-owned.





California exported **\$175.1 billion** in goods to foreign markets in 2021, a 12% increase compared to 2020 driven by continued economic recovery from the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the global economy. California's largest markets in 2021 were:

- Mexico (\$27.2 billion)
- Canada (\$17.9 billion)
- China (\$16.7 billion)
- Japan (\$11.9 billion)
- South Korea (\$11.6 billion)



**Agricultural exports** are important to California's economy, totaling **22.3 billion** In 2020, according to the USDA.

Since 2014, the **U.S. Export-Import Bank** has financed **\$11 billion in exports** from 641 companies in California.

Since 1971, the Overseas Private Investment Corporation - which has been modernized into the **Development Finance Corporation (DFC)** - has invested **\$7.7 billion** in California companies for overseas investment.

Since 1992, the **U.S. Trade and Development Agency** has helped facilitate **\$3 billion** in exports from California companies.



## EDUCATION + VOLUNTEERISM

Since 1961, **31,723 Peace Corps volunteers** from California have

served in dozens of countries overseas.

In 2018-2019, **33,456 California students** studied abroad.

During 2020, **160,592** international students were enrolled in California colleges and universities and contributed **\$6.6** billion to the California economy.
