AMERICA AND THE WORLD: HOW CALIFORNIA WINS

California is one of the world's largest economies, fueled by trade and exports that support nearly 5.1 million jobs in the state. California exports about \$368 billion worth of goods and services annually, led by the state's thriving agriculture and technology manufacturing industry. But it isn't just big business that benefits – 95% of all California exporters are small- and medium-sized businesses.

BOOSTING CALIFORNIA JOBS & EXPORTS

In California, 5,100,000 jobs are supported by trade, representing 20.0% of all jobs in the state.

In 2023, **61,340 companies** exported goods from California, of which 95% were small- and medium-sized enterprises. Additionally, in 2022, **852,300 people** were employed by affiliates of companies at least 50% foreign-owned.

California exports about \$368 billion in goods and services to overseas markets each year. California's top export markets are:

- Mexico (\$40.3 billion)
- Canada (\$34.2 billion)
- China (\$25.2 billion)
- United Kingdom (\$23.8 billion)
- Ireland (\$22.5 billion)

Agricultural exports are important to California's economy, totaling **\$24.3 billion** annually, according to the USDA.

Since 2014, the U.S. Export-Import Bank has financed \$15 billion in exports from 673 companies in California.

The Millennium Challenge Corporation has provided \$81 million in funding to California organizations since the agency's inception in 2004.

Since 1992, the U.S. Trade and Development Agency has helped facilitate \$3 billion in exports from California companies.

EDUCATION + VOLUNTEERISM

Since 1961, 31,049 Peace Corps volunteers from California have served in dozens of countries overseas.

From 2023-2024, 140,858 international students were enrolled in California colleges and universities, contributing \$6.4 billion to the California economy.
