AMERICA AND THE WORLD: HOW IOWA WINS

lowa has long been the heart of America's food production and continues to grow its role as a producer for the world, exporting \$27 billion worth of goods and services annually. Iowa's exports also benefit many other parts of its economy, with international trade supporting more than 380,000 jobs in the state.



BOOSTING IOWA JOBS & EXPORTS

In Iowa, 380,000 jobs are supported by trade, representing 16.7% of all jobs in the state.

In 2023, 3,172 companies exported goods from lowa, of which 81% were small- and medium-sized enterprises. Additionally, in 2022, **67,500 people** were employed by affiliates of companies at least 50% foreign-owned.

lowa exports about \$27 billion in goods and services to overseas markets each year. Iowa's top export markets are:

- Canada (\$5.8 billion)
- Mexico (\$3.6 billion)
- China (\$3.4 billion)
- Japan (\$1.6 billion)
- Germany (1.2 billion)

Agricultural exports are important to lowa's economy, totaling \$13.5 billion annually, according to the USDA.

Since 2014, the U.S. Export-Import Bank has financed \$324 million in exports from 38 companies in Iowa.

Since 1992, the U.S. Trade and Development Agency has helped facilitate \$172 million in exports from Iowa companies.

EDUCATION + VOLUNTEERISM

Since 1961, **2,615 Peace Corps volunteers** from Iowa have served in dozens of countries overseas.

From 2023-2024, **8,515** international students were enrolled in lowa colleges and universities, contributing \$272 million to the lowa economy.
