AMERICA AND THE WORLD: HOW MISSISSIPPI WINS

Exports of Mississippi-made products come from a broad range of categories, including petroleum and coal, transportation equipment, and computer and electronic products. In fact, nearly 2,000 Mississippi companies export about \$17 billion worth of goods and services annually, including to emerging markets like Panama. International trade supports more than 310,000 jobs in the state.

BOOSTING MISSISSIPPI JOBS & EXPORTS

In Mississippi, 310,000 jobs are supported by trade, representing 20.0% of all jobs in the state.

In 2023, **1,932 companies** exported goods from Mississippi, of which **75%** were **small- and medium-sized enterprises**. Additionally, in 2022, **49,800 people** were employed by affiliates of companies at least 50% foreign-owned.

Mississippi exports about \$17 billion in goods and services to overseas markets each year. Mississippi's top export markets are:

- Canada (\$2.4 billion)
- Mexico (\$2.2 billion)
- Panama (\$1.7 billion)
- China (\$1.3 billion)
- Netherlands (\$846 million)


Agricultural exports are important to Mississippi's economy, totaling **\$2.5** billion annually, according to the USDA.

Since 2014, the U.S. Export-Import Bank has financed \$403 million in exports from 21 companies in Mississippi.

Since 1992, the **U.S. Trade and Development Agency** has helped facilitate **\$22** million in exports from Mississippi companies.

EDUCATION + VOLUNTEERISM

Since 1961, **517 Peace Corps volunteers** from Mississippi have served in dozens of countries overseas.

From 2023-2024, 3,135 international students were enrolled in Mississippi colleges and universities, contributing \$84 million to the Mississippi economy.
