## AMERICA AND THE WORLD: HOW UTAH WINS

Utah's exports help to keep the state's economy strong, with the state exporting \$27 billion in goods and services annually. Over 430,000 jobs in the state depend on international trade, with more than 3,800 companies across the state exporting goods. 85% of these companies are also small- and medium-sized businesses.



## **BOOSTING UTAH JOBS & EXPORTS**

In Utah, 430,000 jobs are supported by trade, representing 20.0% of all jobs in the state.

In 2023, 3,801 companies exported goods from Utah, of which 85% were small- and medium-sized enterprises. Additionally, in 2022, **56,600 people** were employed by affiliates of companies at least 50% foreign-owned.

Utah exports about \$27 billion in goods and services to overseas markets each year. Utah's top export markets are:

- United Kingdom (\$8.3 billion)
- Canada (\$2.4 billion)
- Mexico (\$1.8 billion)
- China (\$1.7 billion)
- Japan (\$1.2 billion)

**Agricultural exports** are important to Utah's economy, totaling \$512 million annually, according to the USDA.

Since 2014, the U.S. Export-Import Bank has financed \$237 million in exports from 27 companies in Utah.

The Millennium Challenge Corporation has provided \$1.9 million in funding to Utah organizations since the agency's inception in 2004.

Since 1992, the U.S. Trade and Development Agency has helped facilitate \$67 million in exports from Utah companies.







## **EDUCATION + VOLUNTEERISM**

Since 1961, 1,204 Peace Corps volunteers from Utah have served in dozens of countries overseas.

From 2023-2024, 9,799 international students were enrolled in Utah colleges and universities, contributing \$292 million to the Utah economy.
